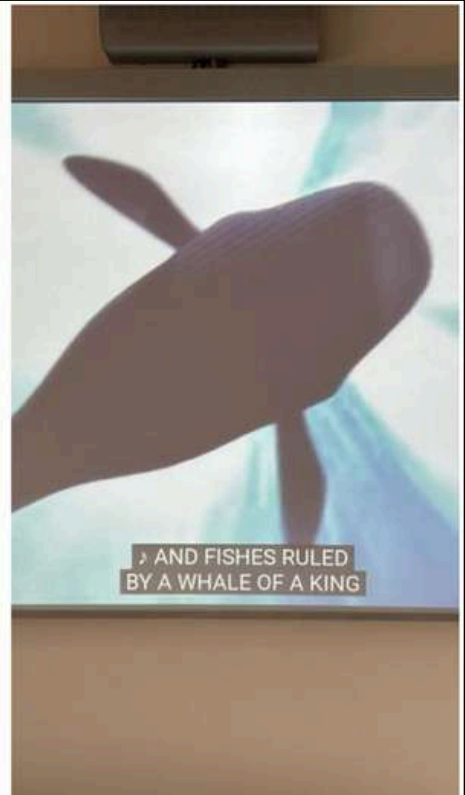
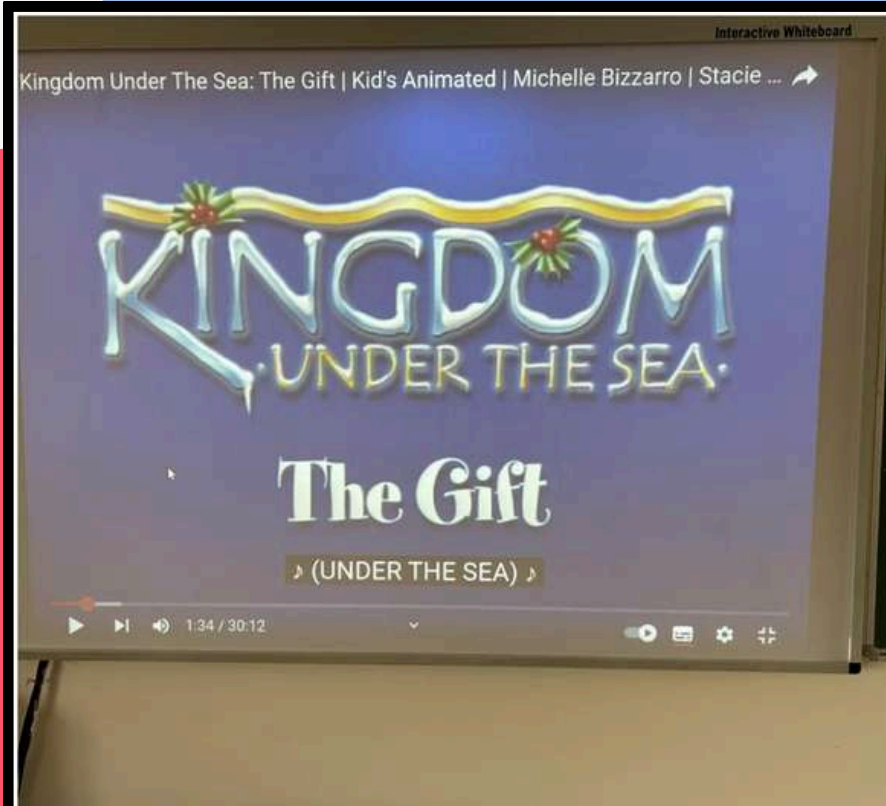

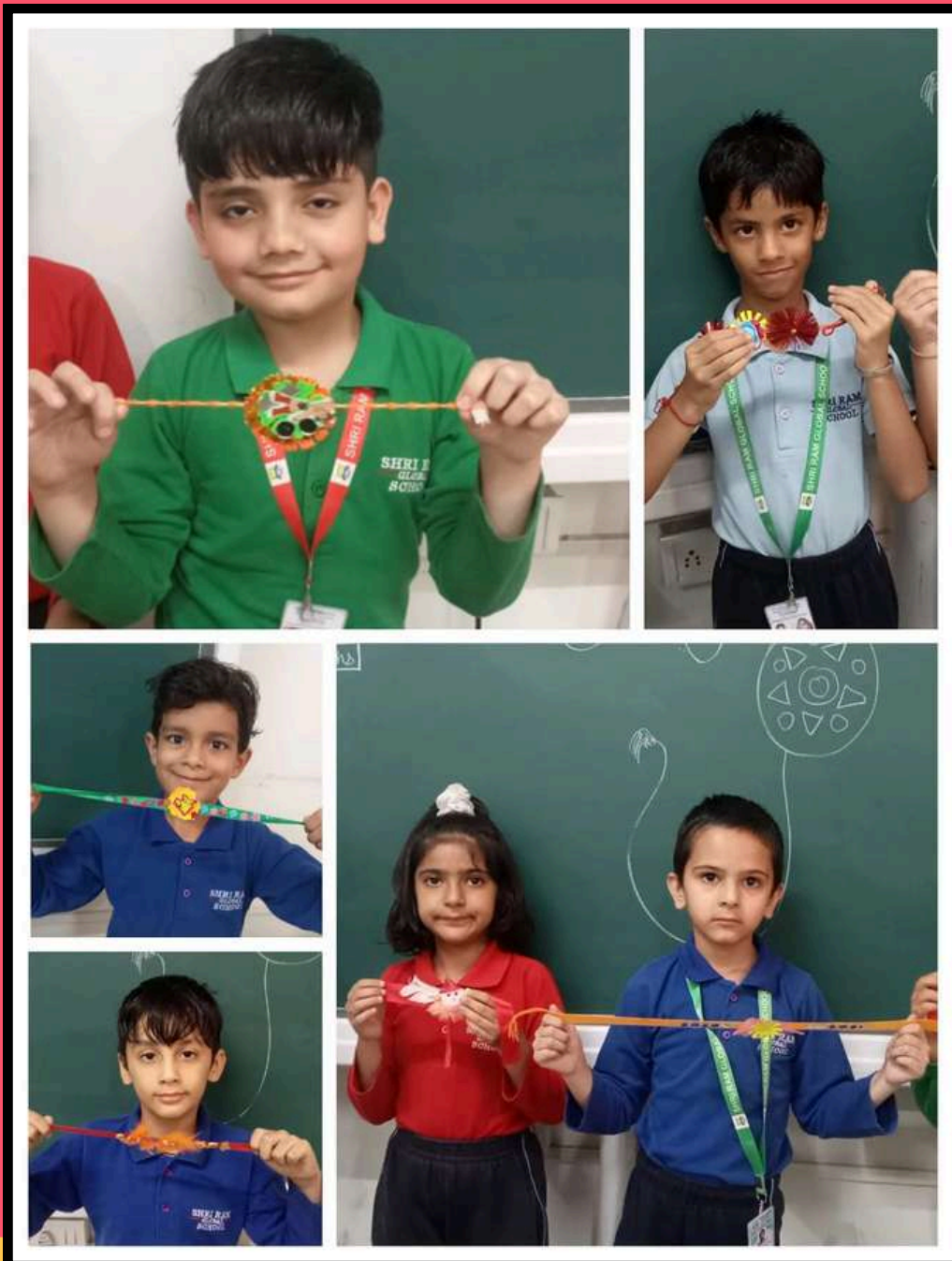
Raksha Bandhan Celebration

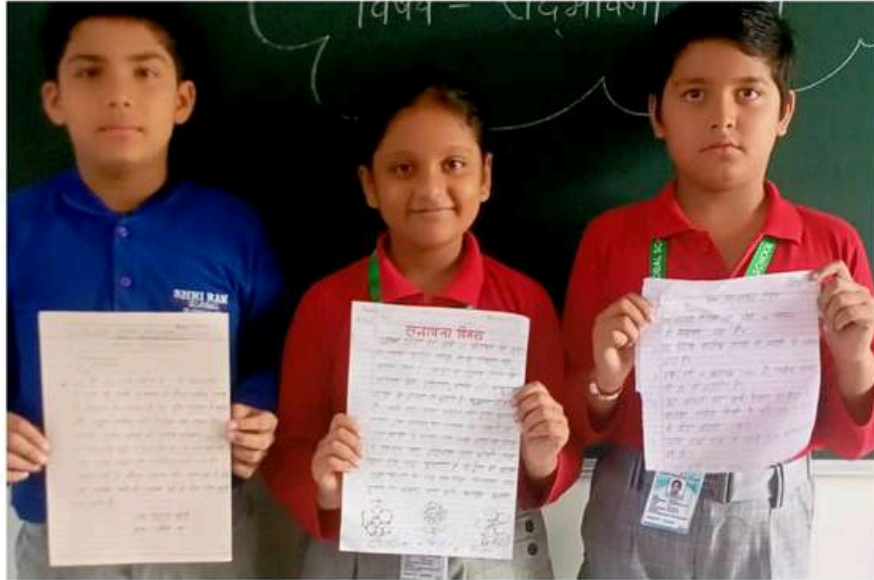

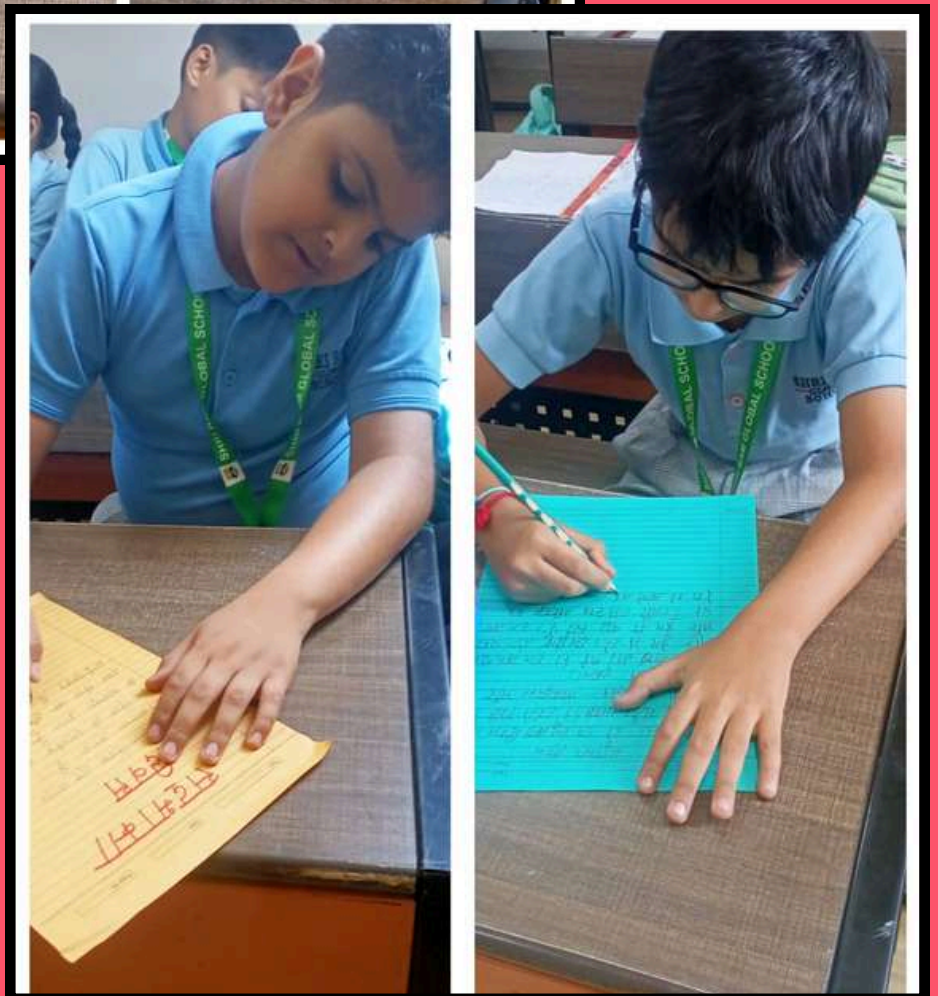
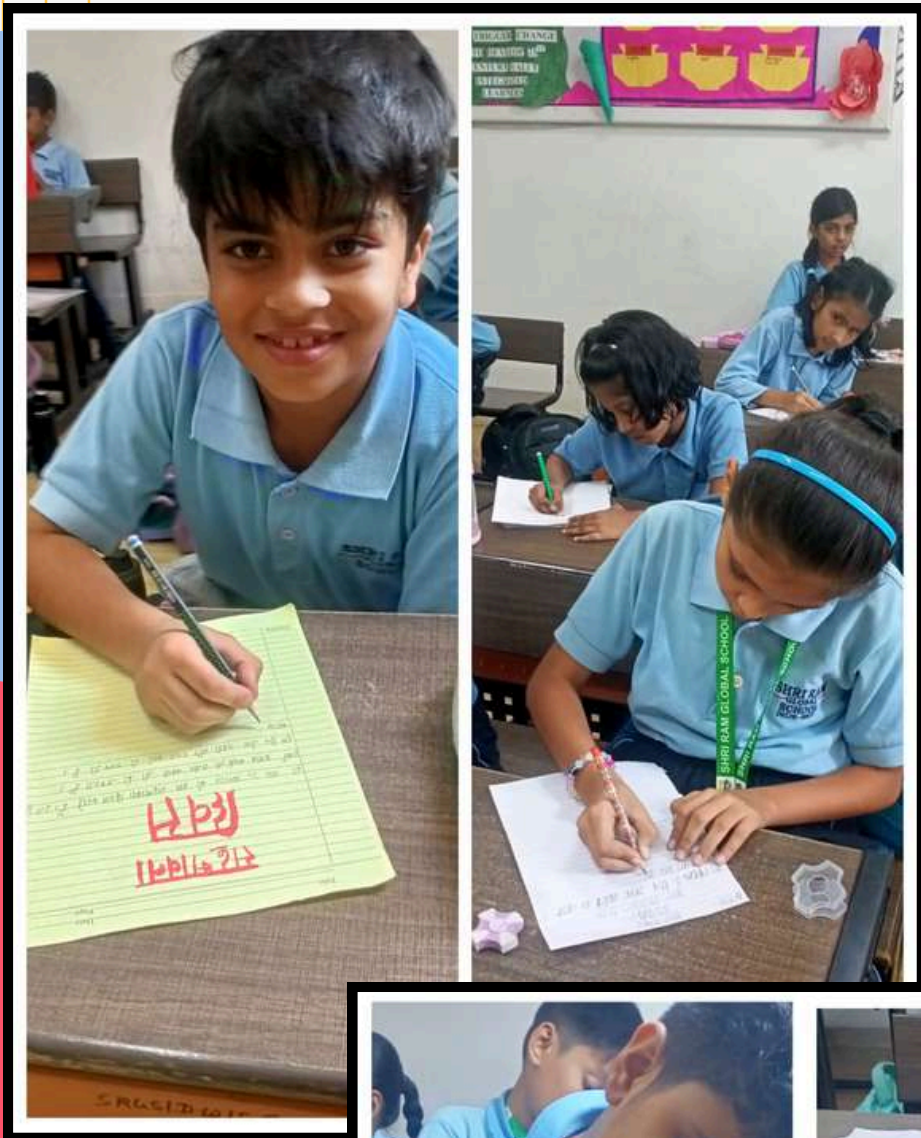




Inter Class Essay Writing Competition: Sadbhawna Diwas Grade IV- V

Workshop: Changes during Adolescence

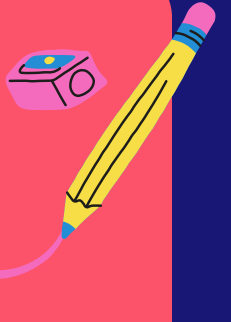
Grade V- VIII

In connection with the inspiring story *My Brother's Wheelchair*, our Grade II students participated in a fun and thoughtful activity called "The Super Wheelchair".

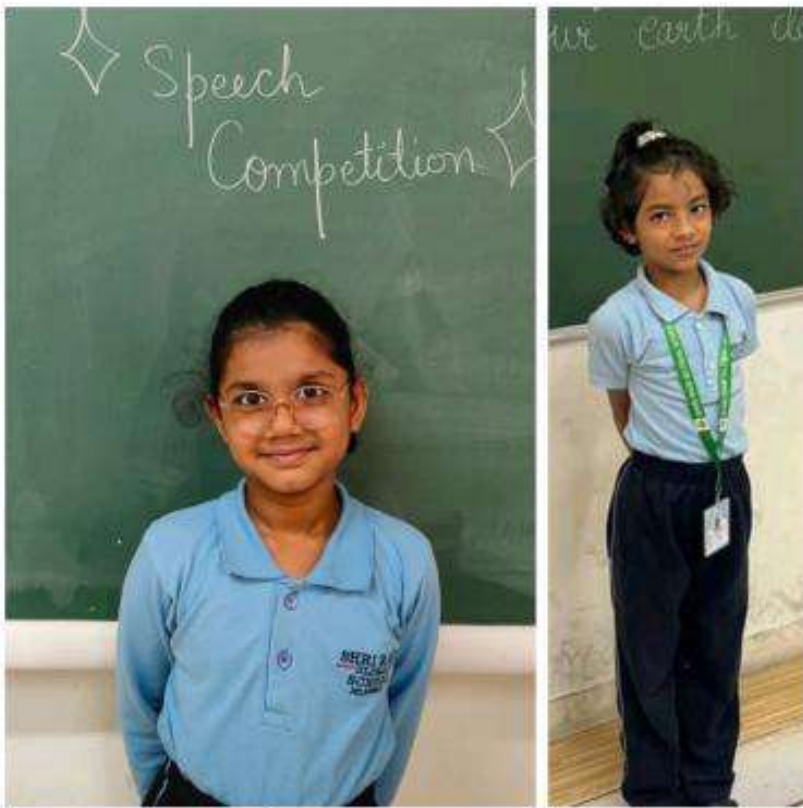

Learning with Fun – Tug of War

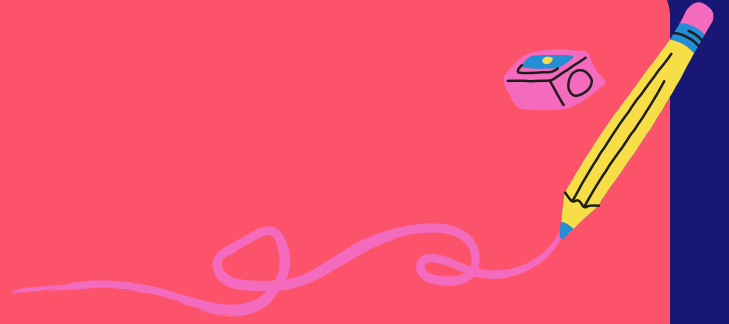

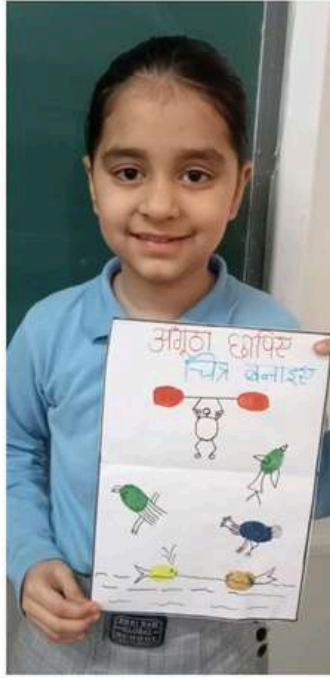
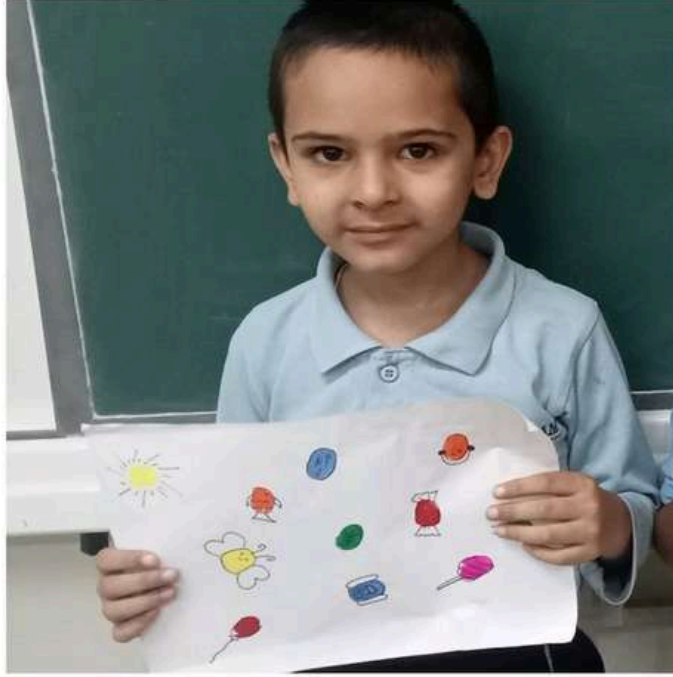




Hindi

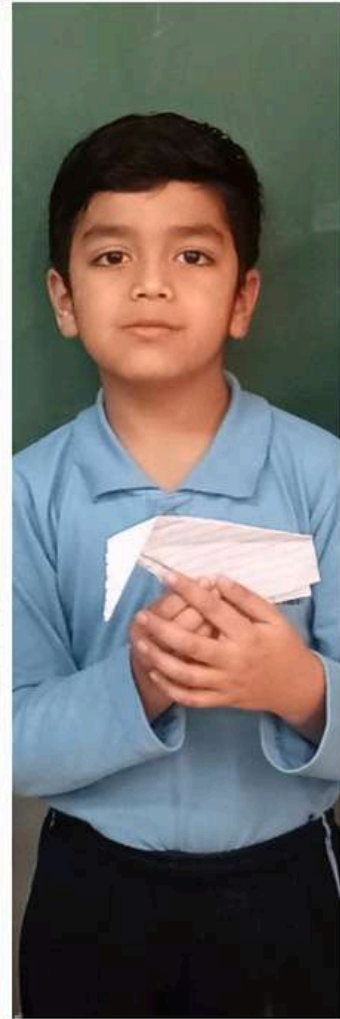


उँगली की डाल पर गौरैया

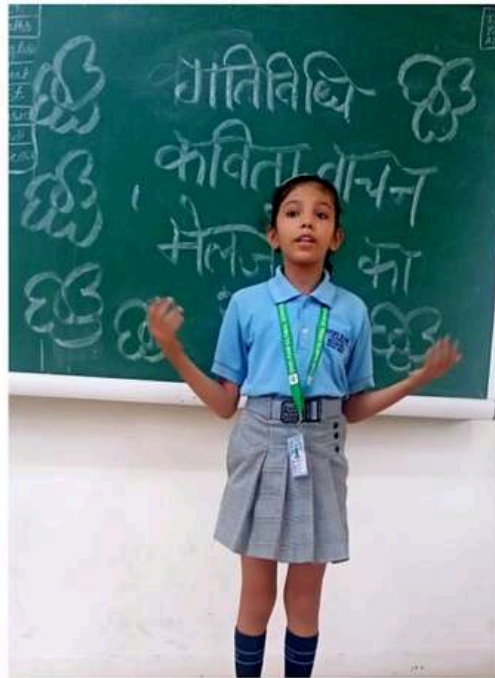
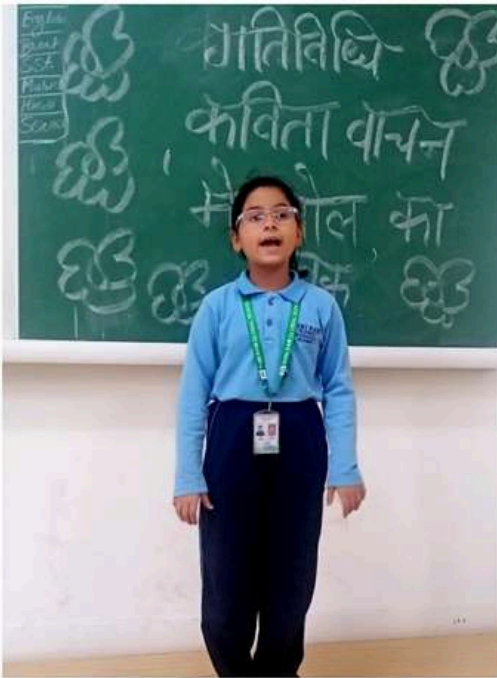

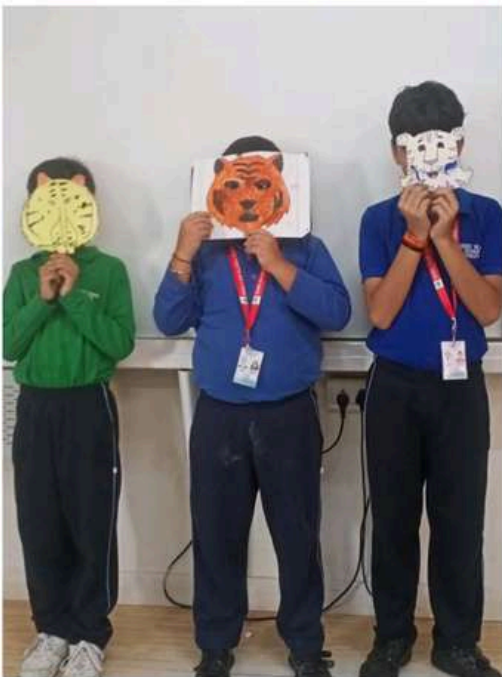




पशु मुखौटा प्रस्तुति

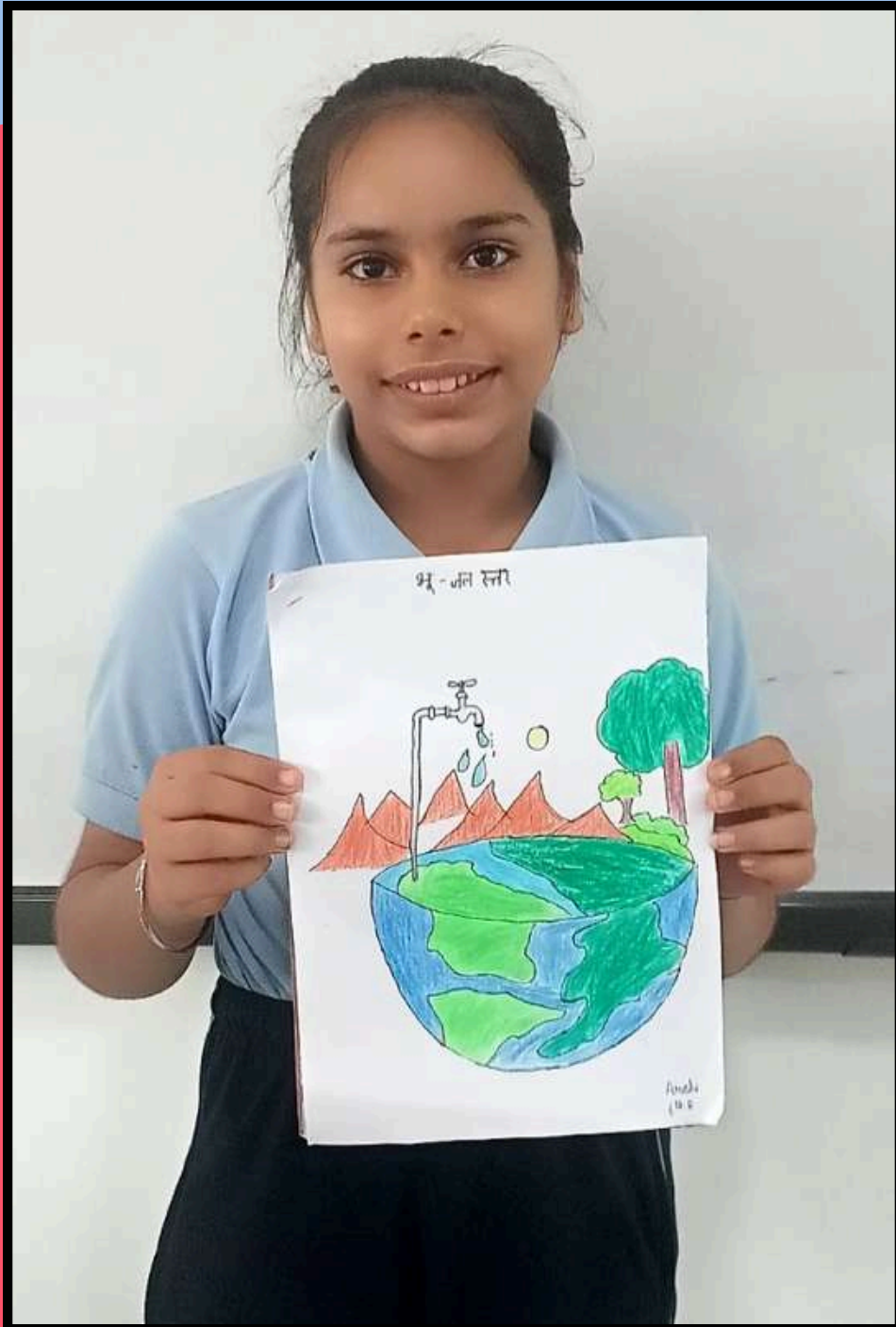

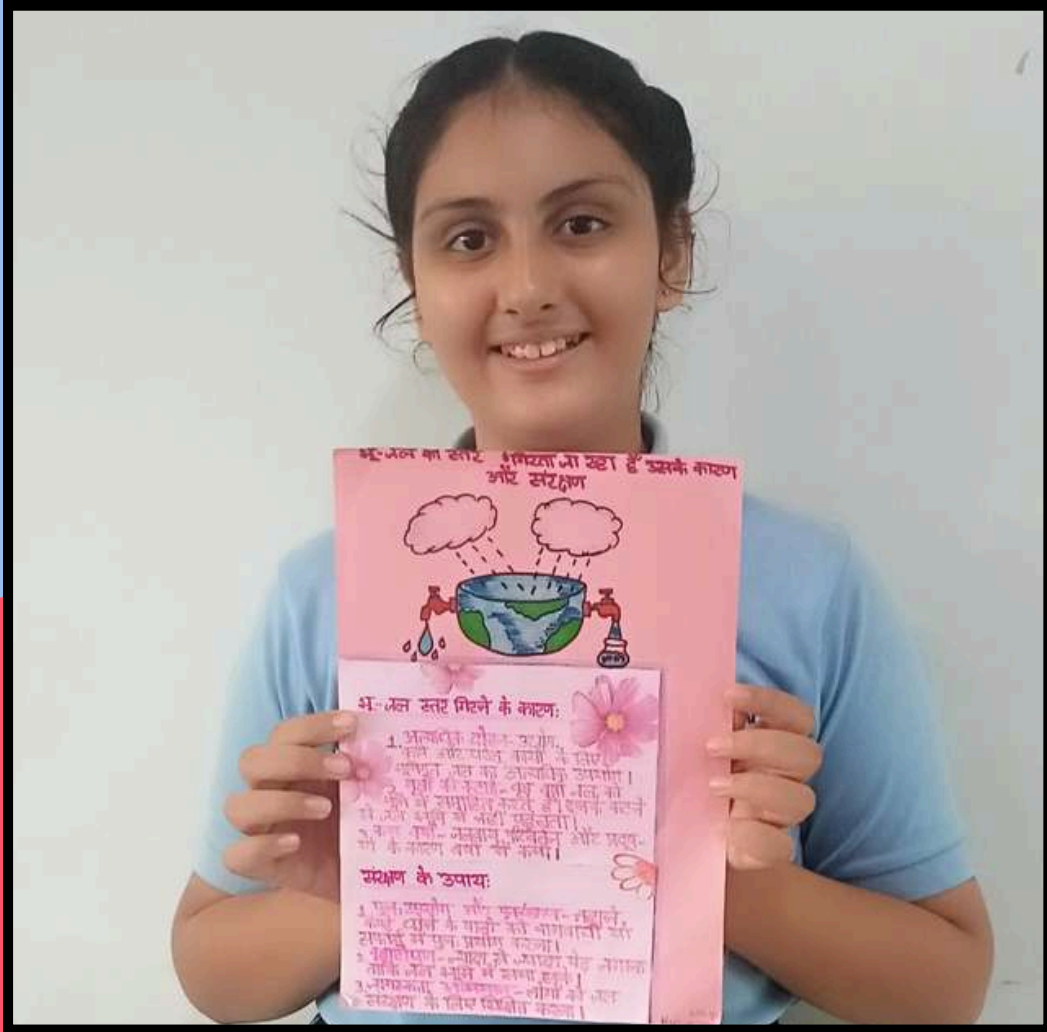




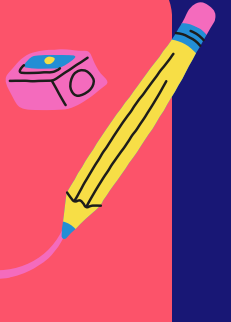
"भू-जल संरक्षण – भविष्य की सुरक्षा"

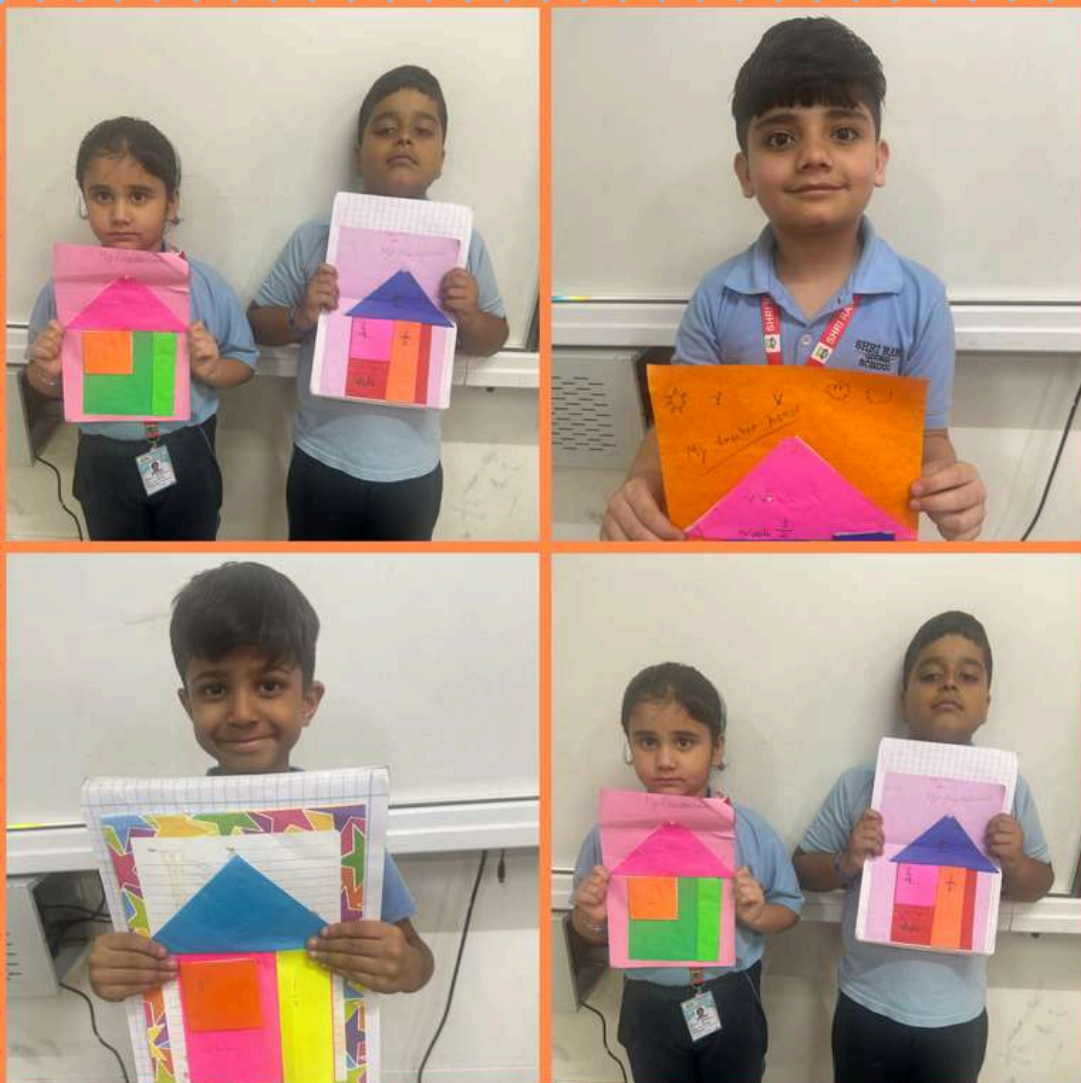


Fraction House Activity

- The walls as whole

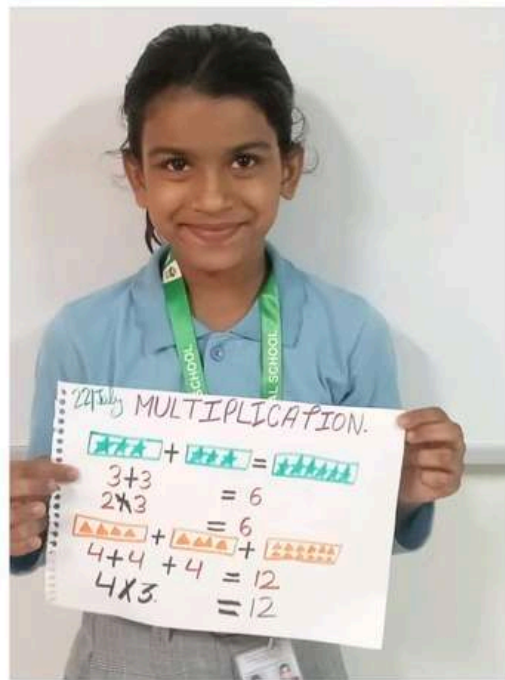
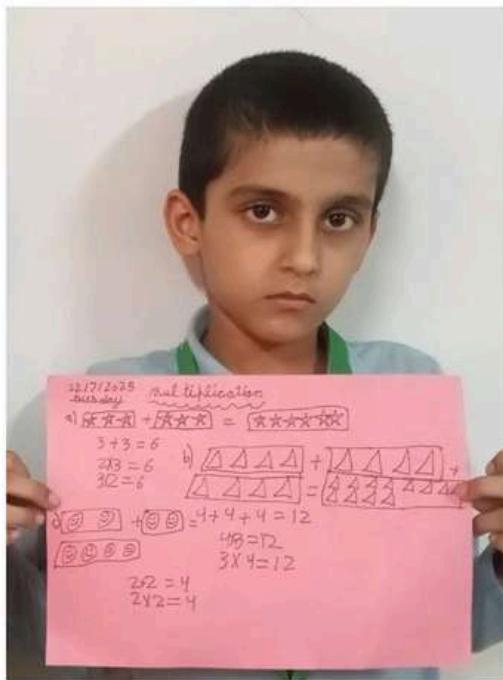


Through this engaging activity, children learned how a whole can be divided into equal parts and how fractions are used to represent them.

The Fraction House turned math into art, and learning into play!

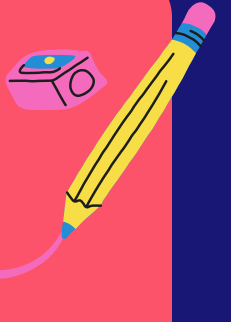
Multiply Mania

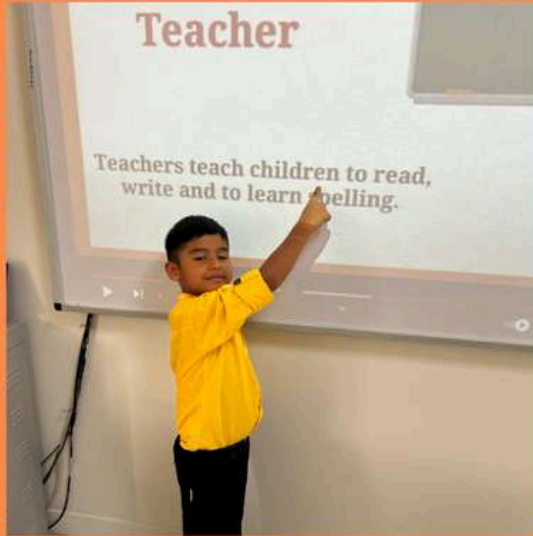

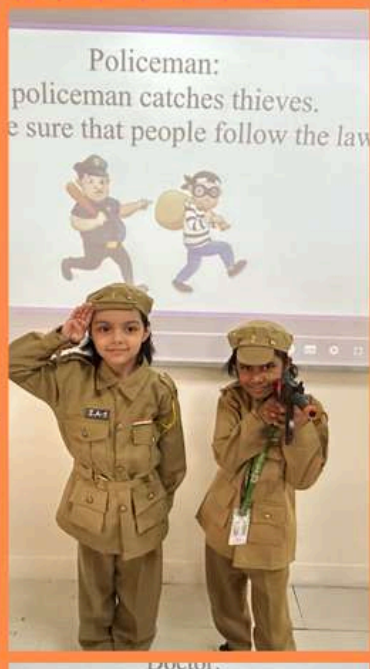


Our Helpers Dressed-Up Activity

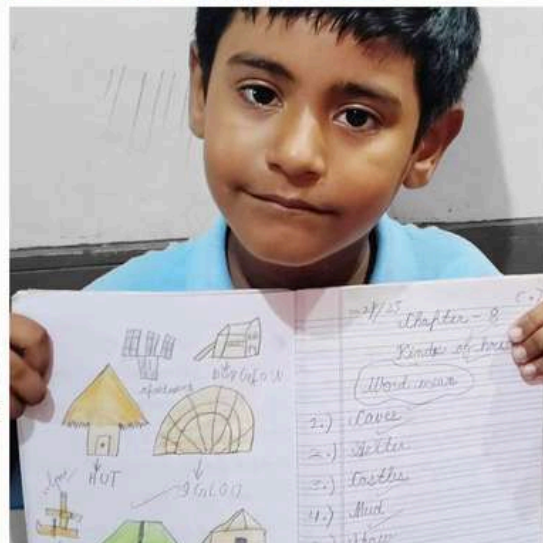
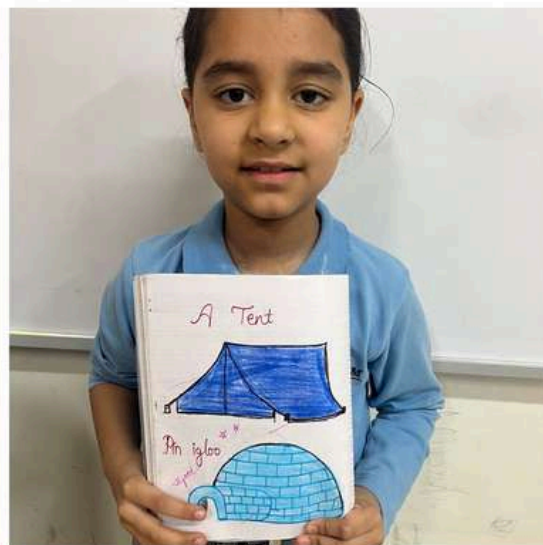




Creativity on Paper –

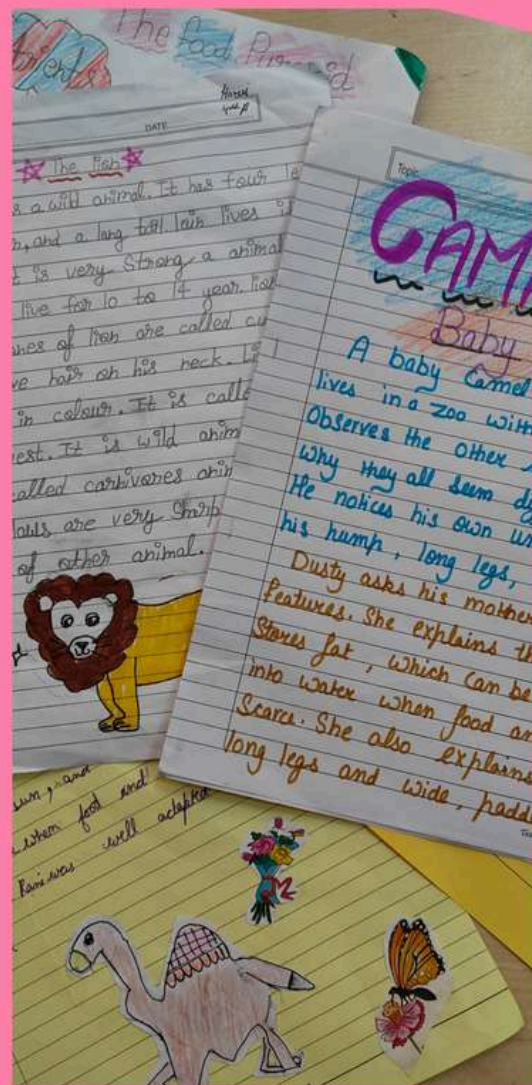
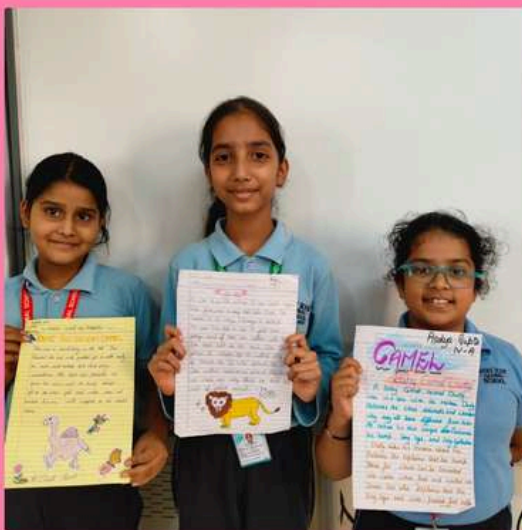
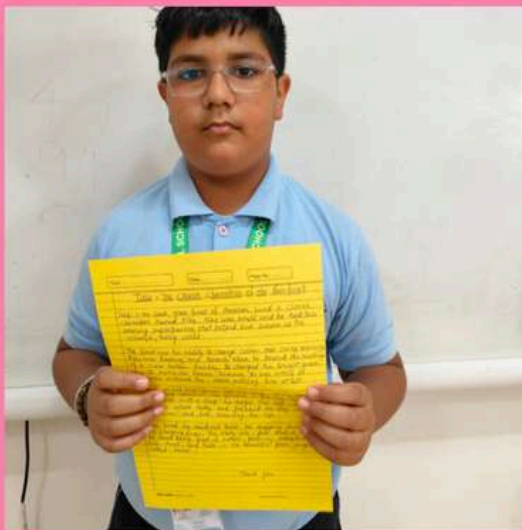
Exploring the Wonders of Human Body – A Visit to the Science Lab

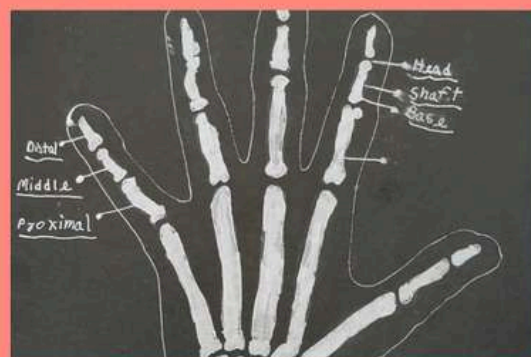
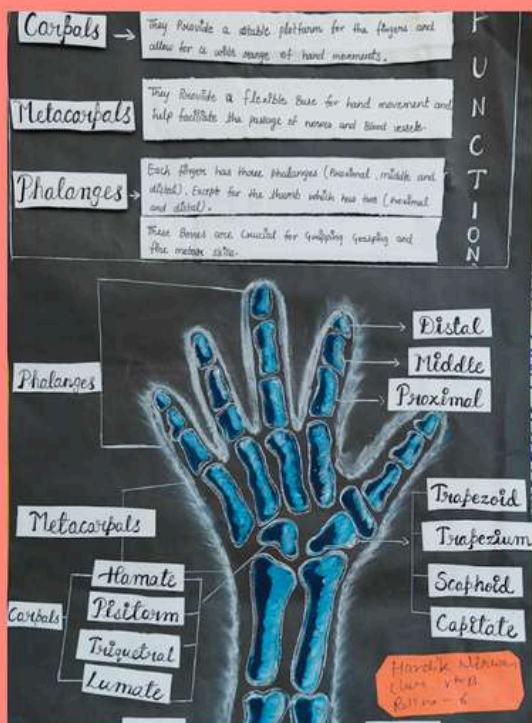
Habitat story writing

Invisible Forces at Work:

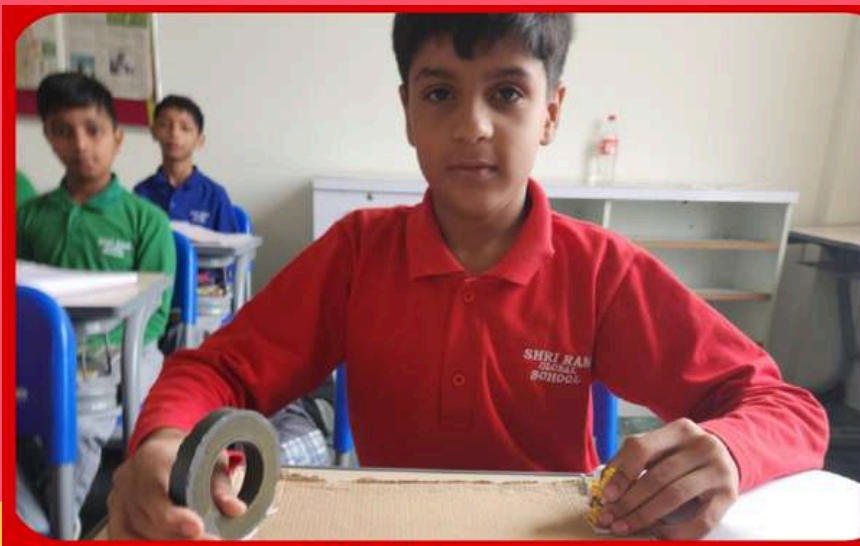
Grade VI Investigates Magnetism

Students of Grade VI recently delved into the fascinating world of magnets through an interactive science activity designed to demonstrate magnetic attraction, repulsion, and polarity. With hands-on experiments, they discovered how magnets interact with various materials and with each other.



By observing how opposite poles attract and like poles repel, students developed a clearer understanding of magnetic forces in action. They also explored ways to find the poles of a magnet using simple techniques, learning that each magnet, no matter its shape, always has a north and south pole.

The activity encouraged curiosity, experimentation, and observation skills, allowing students to connect scientific theory with real-world applications—from compasses to everyday appliances.



Through this engaging session, students realized that magnets are not just toys but vital tools in technology, navigation, and industry. As Albert Einstein once said:

"The important thing is not to stop questioning. Curiosity has its own reason for existing."

This scientific exploration left students inspired, sparking a deeper interest in uncovering the invisible forces that shape our world.

Colours That Speak: Experiments with Acids, Bases, and Indicators



Students of Grade VII recently explored the colourful world of acids, bases, and indicators through a lively hands-on science activity. Using everyday materials like litmus paper and turmeric, they tested various household substances to determine whether they were acidic or basic.

In the experiment, students observed how blue litmus turns red in acids and red litmus turns blue in bases, while turmeric changed its shade when exposed to basic solutions but remained unchanged in acidic ones. These simple yet fascinating tests helped them understand how indicators work and how they can be used to identify substances in daily life.

The activity strengthened students' observation skills, critical thinking, and practical understanding of textbook concepts. It also highlighted how science is present in our kitchens, gardens, and surroundings. By the end of the session, students realized that the colours revealed by indicators are more than just visual changes—they are scientific signals unlocking the hidden properties of substances



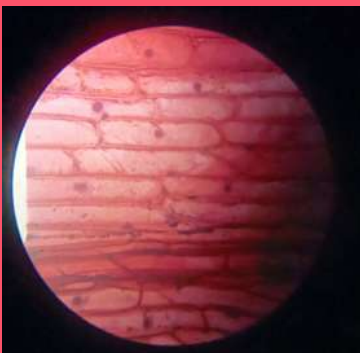
Report on Slide Observation Activity

Chapter: The Invisible World

To strengthen the practical understanding of the chapter The Invisible World, a Slide Observation Activity was organized for the students. The objective was to provide hands-on experience in observing microorganisms under the compound microscope and connecting theoretical knowledge to real-life observation. Students were introduced to the microscope, its parts, and the method of preparing temporary slides. They observed pre-prepared slides of bacteria, yeast, amoeba, and algae.

During the observation, students noted rod-shaped and spherical bacteria, budding yeast cells, amoeba with pseudopodia, and green-colored filaments of algae containing chlorophyll. The activity enabled them to develop microscope-handling skills, recognize structural differences in microorganisms, and appreciate their role in the environment.

The session not only enhanced their observation skills and scientific drawing abilities but also aroused curiosity and fascination. Students were thrilled to see the “invisible world” come alive, bridging the gap between theory and practice.



DNA Isolation Practical Activity

Venue: Biology Laboratory

Chapter: Molecular Basis of Inheritance

Students of Biology performed a practical activity on DNA isolation from banana under the chapter Molecular Basis of Inheritance. Using simple materials like detergent, ethanol, and plant tissue, they learned the process of breaking cell membranes, filtering cellular contents, and precipitating DNA. White, thread-like structures of DNA were observed and carefully collected on a glass rod. The activity helped students visualize DNA for the first time, strengthening their understanding of heredity and making theoretical concepts more tangible.

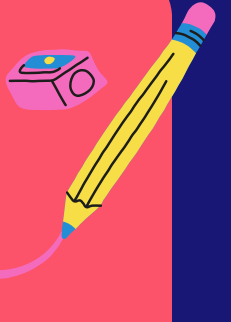




Seven Sister States of India Activity

Lakshadweep: Beauty Beyond Shores



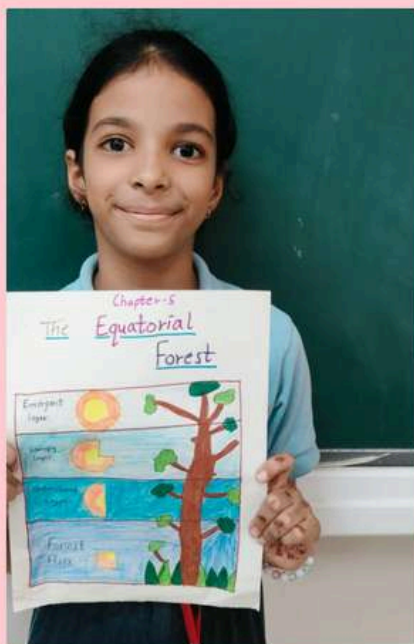

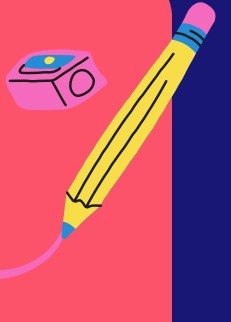
The activity not only made learning fun but also helped students appreciate the charm and simplicity of island life. The effort, creativity, and excitement of the students were truly heartwarming.

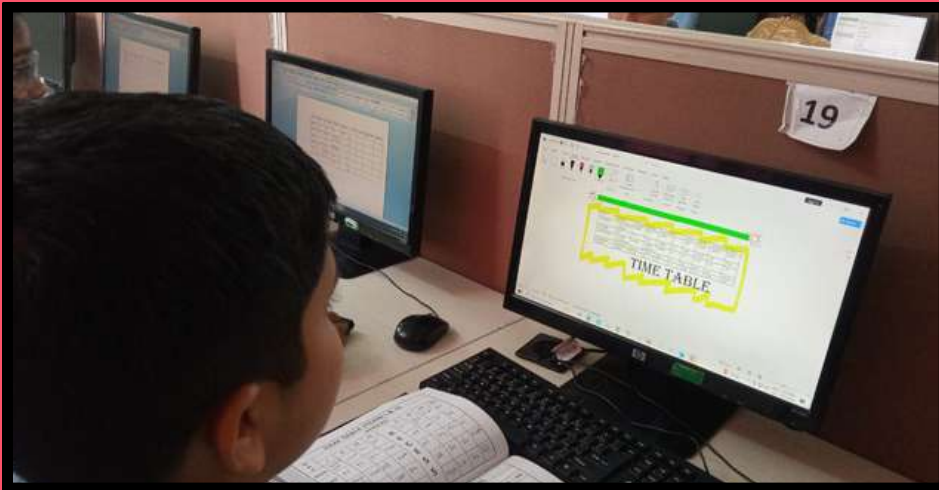


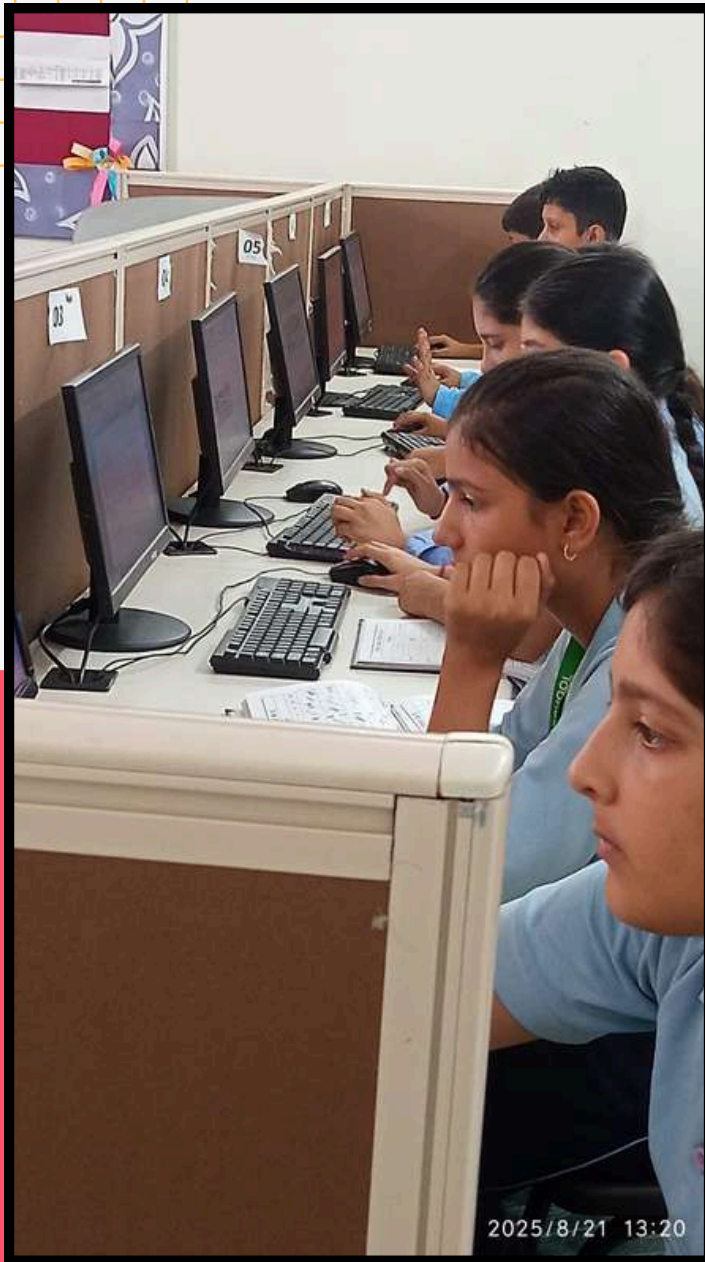

Smart Scheduling: Grade VII Creates Timetable in Excel

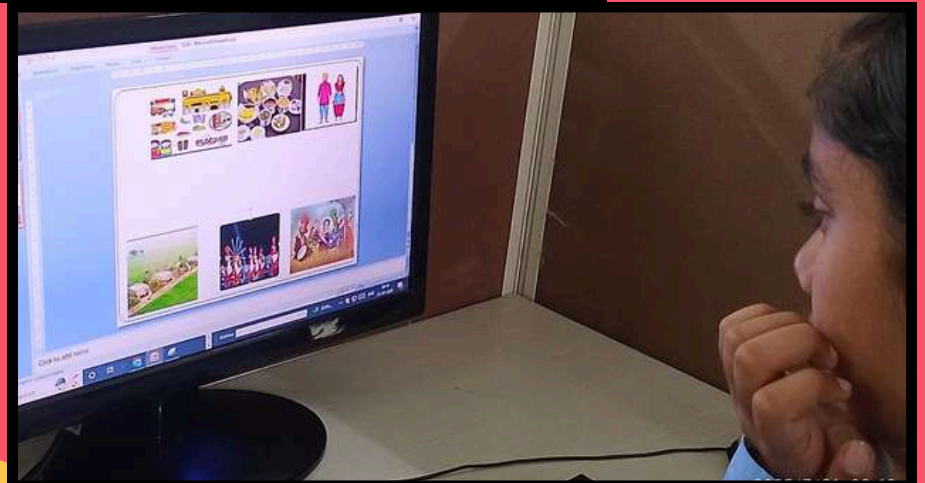

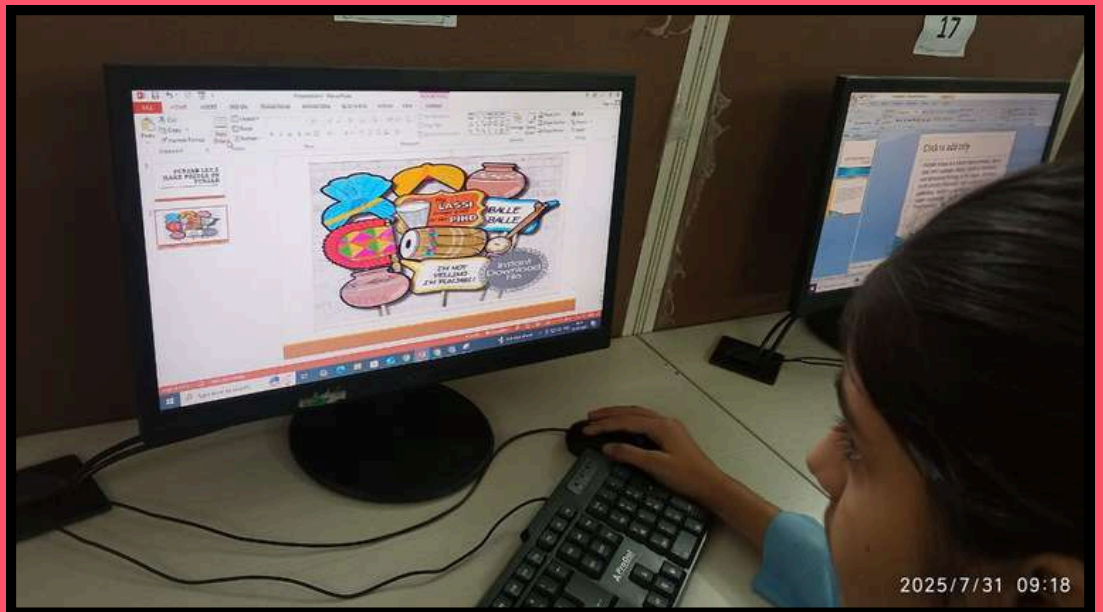
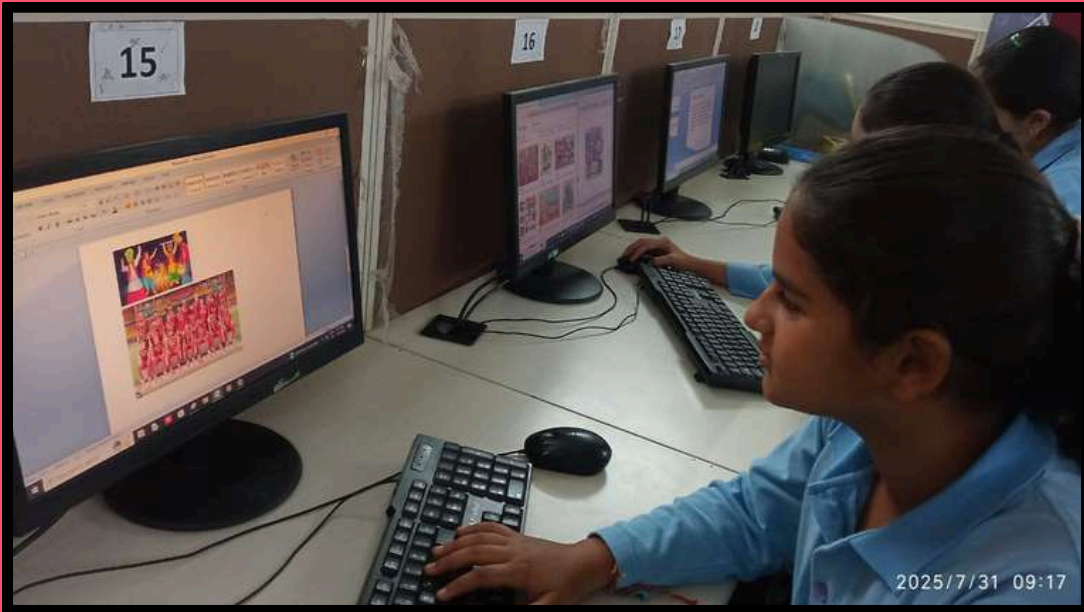




Explores Punjab through “Surf and Create”
